

Project summary

This project enhanced the access to solar energy and equipment management for 12 women's unions and Economic Interest Groups (EIGs) located in the outskirts of Dakar and the Saloum delta. This funding initiative aligned with FETEE's overarching goal by facilitating access to solar energy for 500 women farmers and processors of agri-food products.

Achievements

Visited the **three Economic Interest Groups (EIG)** to size the equipment and obtain quotes. **47 people, including 45 women**, benefited from the solar pump.



Purchased and transported of **solar equipments** from France to Senegal and installation of the equipment's in the 3 EIGs.



Trained referents within the EIGs for the proper **use of the solar equipment**, focused on solar panel maintenance and the initial steps to take if any issues arise. Development of a easily accessible **practical guide** for their beneficiaries.



Trained the referents to use the Meyobi application for data collection and analysis of the equipment's impacts.



Used the equipment and collected data to **monitor and evaluate** the impact of the equipment within the MSEs, with regular visit of the team project
