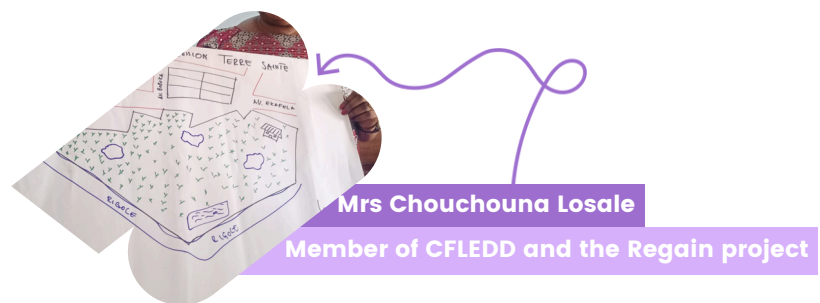




Project summary

With the help of the fund, CFLEDD mapped the areas belonging to local communities and especially women, in order to obtain land titles from customary and tradition authorities.

Achievements



CFLEDD identified women in local communities who are seeking to secure **land titles**.



Trained **5 local cartographers** of which four men and one woman. They received training on GPS and other tools and techniques for mapping.



Collected **GPS data** to create the **maps**, and reviewed and validated these sketches.



The final step was to deliver the **finalised customary land titles** for those whose land had been properly mapped in the process and had the correct documentation.



In total **25 women in Equateur province** and **25 women in the Mai Ndombe province** were able to obtain their customary land title thanks to this mapping exercise.
