### Beijing+30

- **What it means:** Review of 30 years of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action
- **Introduction:** This refers to the 30-year review of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, a comprehensive policy agenda for women's rights adopted in 1995. [More info](#)

- **What it means:** Convention on Biological Diversity Conference of the Parties
- **Introduction:** The CBD COP is the governing body of the Convention on Biological Diversity, which meets biennially to review progress, set priorities, and adopt work programs. [More info](#)

## CEDAW sessions

- **What it means:** Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) sessions
- **Introduction:** An international treaty adopted by the UN General Assembly to eliminate discrimination against women and promote gender equality. [More info](#)
- **Climate and Gender Justice Initiatives:** CEDAW's General Recommendations address the impacts of climate change on women's rights and call for gender-responsive climate policies.

- **What it means:** Commission on the Status of Women (CSW)
- **Introduction:** The CSW is a functional commission of the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) dedicated to gender equality and the advancement of women. It meets annually to evaluate progress, identify challenges, and set global standards. [More info](#)

- **Introduction:** The FfD process aims to ensure sufficient financial resources for sustainable development, addressing systemic issues and mobilising international cooperation. The last major Financing for Development (FfD) conferences were:

- **Introduction:** The ICPD, held in 1994, resulted in a Programme of Action emphasising the link between population, development, and individual well-being, particularly reproductive health and rights. More info
